Why dental implants?

Cavities, periodontal disease, trauma—teeth can be lost for any number of reasons. Your dentist may recommend a dental implant:





IMPLANTS VERSUS BRIDGES

While bridges may require additional shaping and generally need replacement after approximately 10 years, implants rarely need maintenance or replacement.
